Completion of the Septuagint Greek Manuscripts which contain The 39 Old Testament Books AND 14 Apocrypha Books.




1st Century AD

Completion of All Original Greek Manuscripts which make up The 27 Books of the New Testament.

Athanasius, the Bishop of Alexandria, identifies the 27 books of the New Testament which are today recognized as the canon of scripture.

Jerome translates the Hebrew and Greek Bible into Latin.



Scriptures have been translated into over 500 Languages.

Wycliffe is the First Person to Produce a (Hand-Written) manuscript Copy of the Complete Bible.


Gutenberg invents the printing press; books may now be mass-produced instead of individually hand-written. The first book ever printed is Gutenberg's Bible in Latin.



Erasmus produces a Greek/Latin Parallel New Testament.



William Tyndale's New Testament.


The First New Testament printed in English.

each chapter.




The Bishops Bible

1611 AD:

The King James Bible Printed, originally with all 80 Books. The Apocrypha was first removed in 1885 leaving only 66 books.



Dead Sea Scrolls found: Around 850 documents -The library was hidden away in caves around the outbreak of the First Jewish Revolt (A.D. 66-70) as the Roman army advanced against the rebel Jews.
