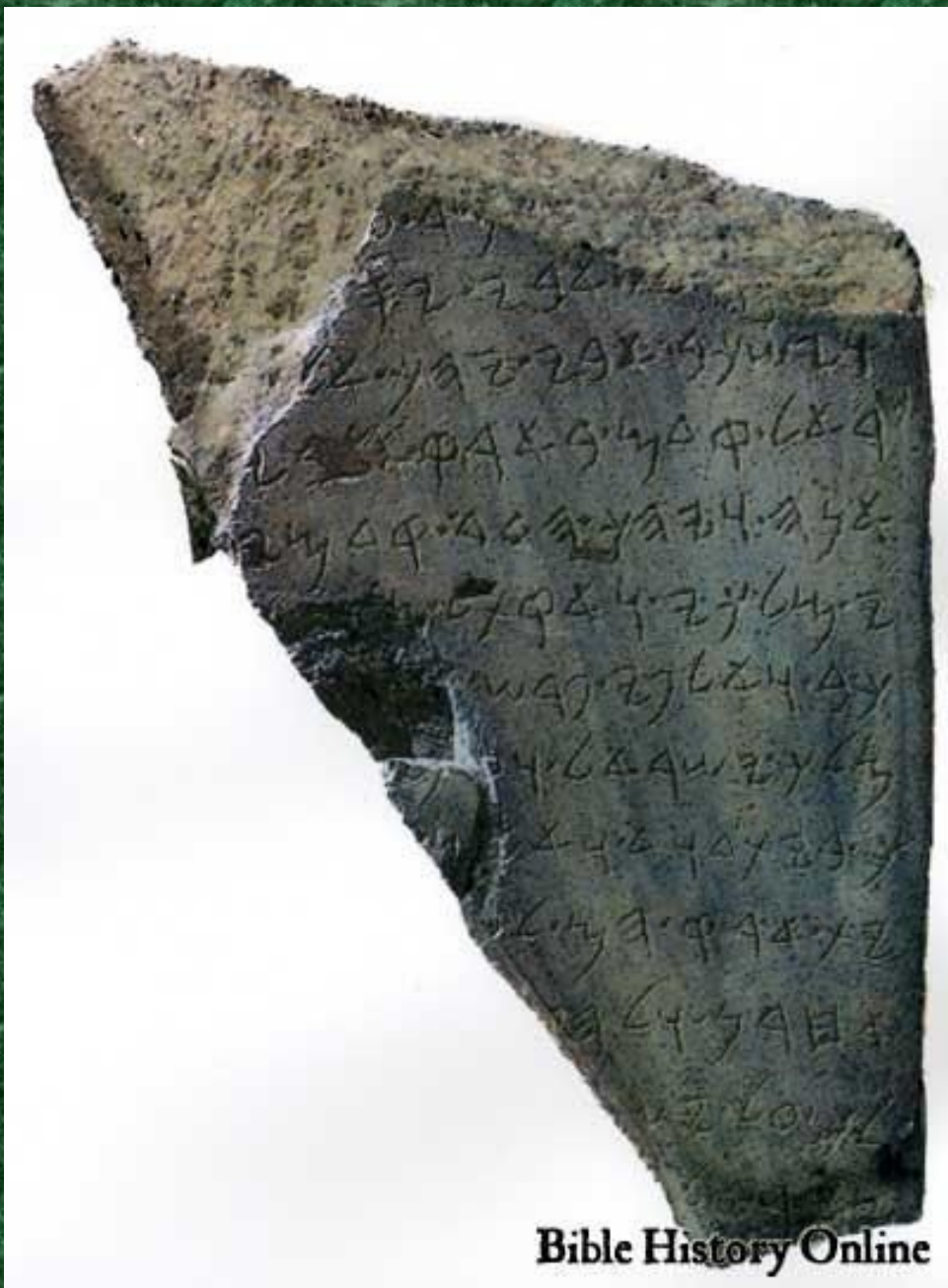


KING DAVID

David

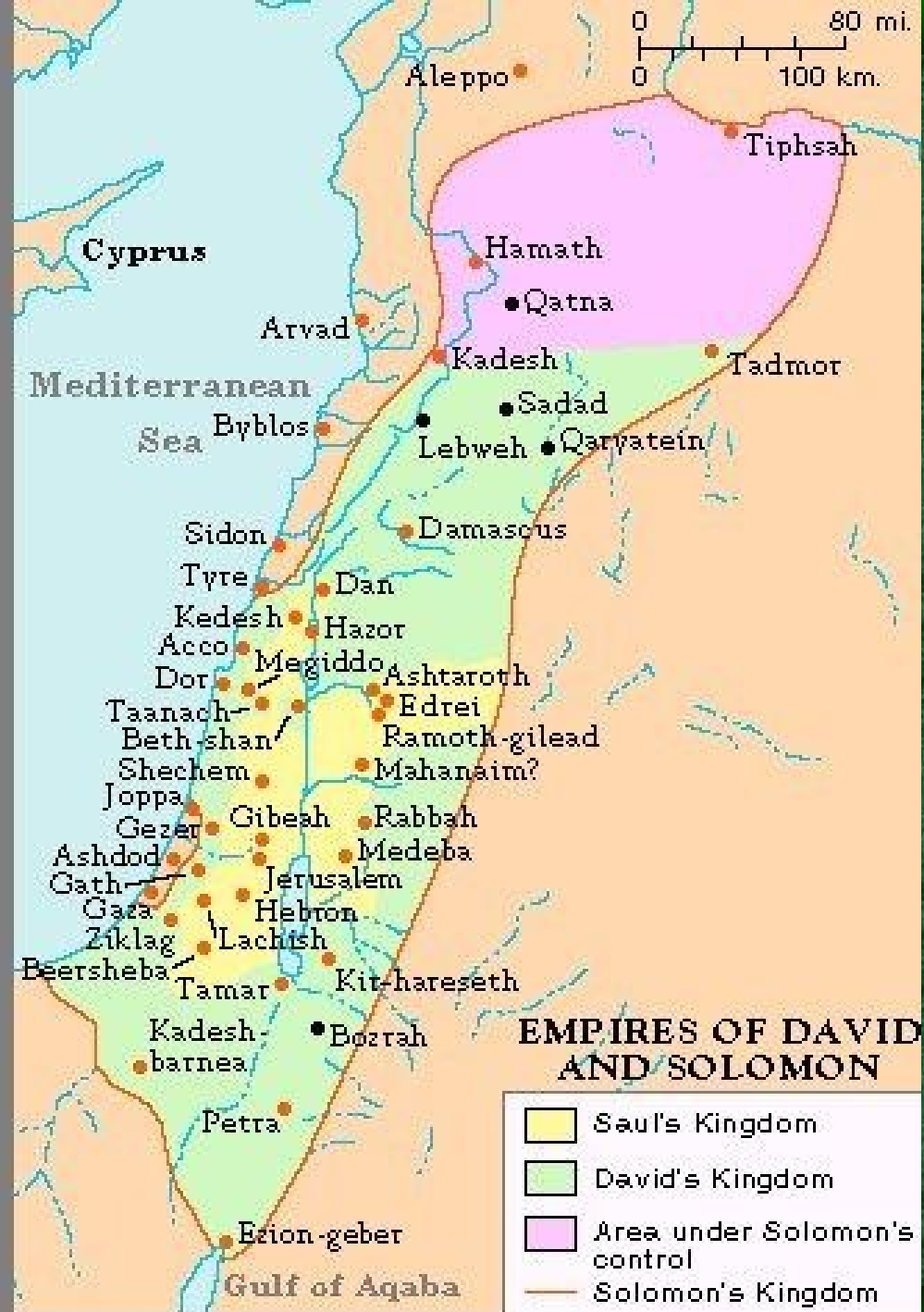
1. He was 30 years old when he became a king.

Early Stage

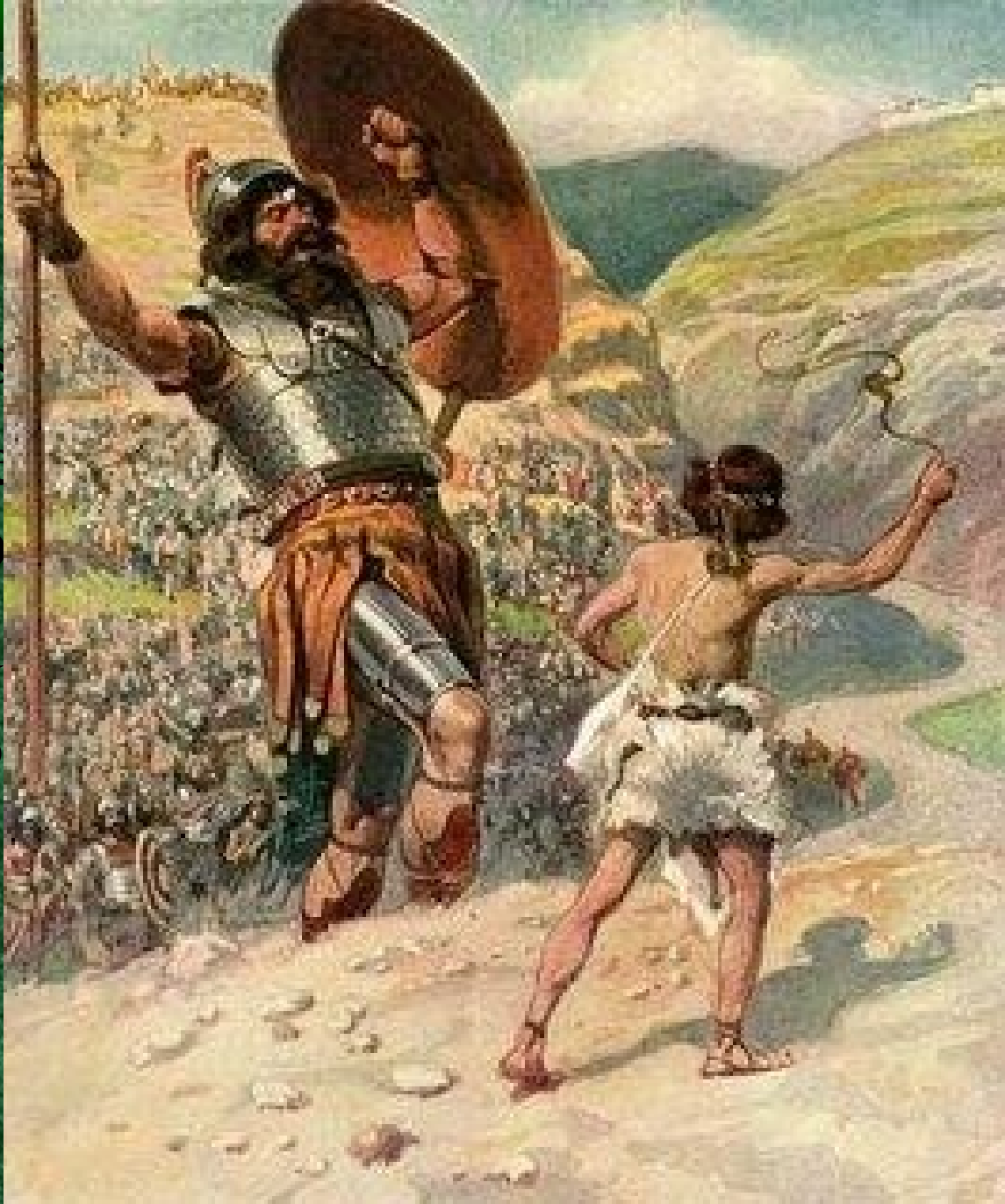
- After God rejected the foolishness of Saul, He sent Samuel to Bethlehem to anoint David as successor.

David in Hebron

Upon Saul's death, David went to Hebron where he was anointed as king of Judah.

Ish-Bosheth – The legitimate son of Saul was still alive.

When the son of Saul was assassinated, David was proclaimed king of Israel.

David and Jerusalem

- David then moved his capital from Hebron to Jebus – The land of the Jebusites.
- He attacked first the Jebusites then brought the ark of the covenant in that city.

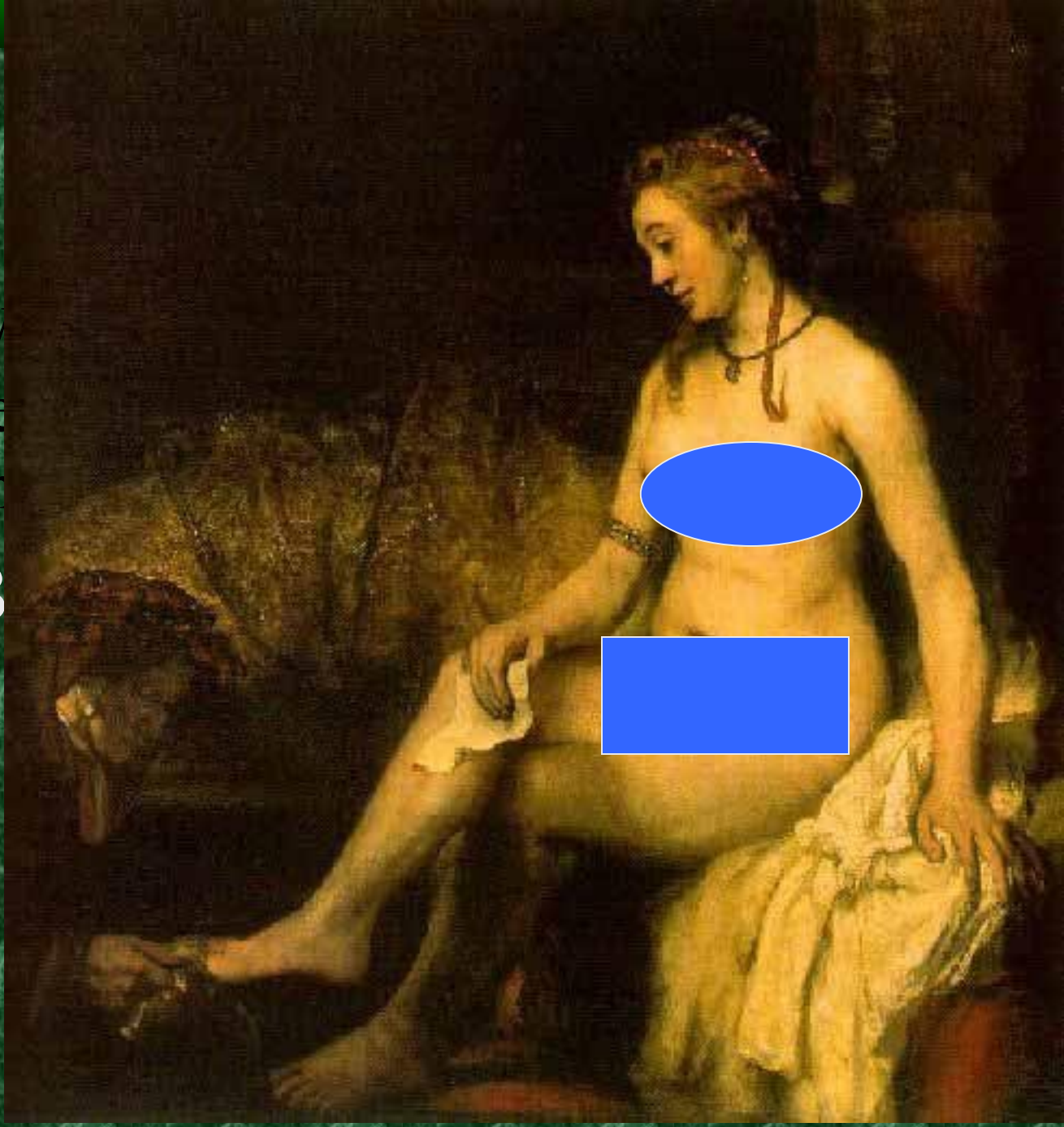
The Similarity of Saul and David
