

What happens when water boils? What happens when water freezes?






His Conversion - Acts 9:1-9 ***When water** changes to ice or steam, we say that it has been "converted." It is different from the original water.

Saul's transformed

The transformation of Saul is for many people one of the most intriguing stories in the book of Acts.


- A violent persecutor of the church is transformed into a mighty apostle. The change in the direction of this man's life is due to the supernatural intervention of God.
- Saul is introduced as a man implacably opposed to the cause of Christ and his people. In v1 he is described as "breathing out murderous threats against the Christians".







Very Religious A Pharisee - Acts 23:6 Philippians 3:4-6 (NKJV) ⁵ circumcised the eighth day, of the stock of Israel, of the tribe of Benjamin, a Hebrew of the Hebrews; concerning the law, a Pharisee; ⁶ concerning zeal, persecuting the church; concerning the righteousness which is in the law, blameless. 7






Very Religious
A Pharisee - Acts 23:6

Galatians 1:13-14 (NKJV) ¹³ For you have heard of my former conduct in Judaism, how I persecuted the church of God beyond measure and *tried to* destroy it. ¹⁴ And I advanced in Judaism beyond many of my contemporaries in my own nation, being more exceedingly zealous for the traditions of my fathers.





Devout - Sincere

Acts 22:3 – zealous towards God
Acts 23:1 - I have lived in all good conscience before God until this day
Acts 24:16 - I myself always strive to have a conscience without offense toward God and men.

Acts 26:9 - Indeed, I myself thought I must do many things contrary to the name of Jesus of Nazareth.

How do we account for this terrible attack on the followers of the Way?

- Remember, Saul had been exposed to the gospel through Stephen's teaching.
- He hadn't liked what he'd heard: it challenged the foundation of his own dearly cherished religious beliefs.

He believed that by attempting to be very religious and very good, and by helping his neighbour he could earn the favour and acceptance of God.

The gospel undermines the view that man can save himself!

- The followers of Jesus taught that it was only by The name of Jesus that anyone could be saved!
- St. Paul had spent all his life and energy trying to save himself by doing everything in the law.
- St. Paul describes himself as being this in his letter to the Philipians chapter 3 when he remembers how he used to be the old Saul:

Philipians 3:4-8

though I also might have confidence in the flesh. If anyone else thinks he may have confidence in the flesh, I more so:

⁵ circumcised the eighth day, of the stock of Israel, *of* the tribe of Benjamin, a Hebrew of the Hebrews; concerning the law, a Pharisee;

⁶ concerning zeal, persecuting the church; concerning the righteousness which is in the law, blameless.

But what things were gain to me, these I have counted loss for Christ.

Philipians 3:4-8

excellence of the knowledge of Christ Jesus my Lord, for whom I have suffered the loss of all things, and count them as rubbish, that I may gain Christ

⁹ and be found in Him, not having my own righteousness, which *is* from the law, but that which *is* through faith in Christ, the righteousness which is from God by faith;

It that I may know Him and the power of His resurrection, and the fellowship of His sufferings, being conformed to His death,

At a time when Christians did all in their power to keep out of Saul's way because they could not imagine that such a life could be transformed, God imagined such a reality. God is found at work in what many would describe as 'a hopeless case' for nothing could stand in the way of God's irresistible, drawing and converting grace.

Paul's New Christian Life (ca. AD 35–49)

A. Jesus is "revealed" to Saul. while Saul is on the road to Damascus

- B. Acts 9:3-30; 22:6-21; 26:12-18 three accounts: blinding light
- 1 Cor 9:1a "Am I not free? Am I not an apostle? Have I not <u>seen</u> Jesus our Lord?"
- 1 Cor 15:8 "Last of all, as to one born abnormally, he [Jesus] <u>appeared</u> to me."
- Gal 1:11-16 "God was pleased to <u>reveal</u> his Son to me"

Brief Analysis of Saul's Conversion

Saul before his conversion sincere, zealous, persecutor The "HOW" of his conversion - Jesus appeared to him and sent him to Damascus where he was told what to do -Saul after his conversion – Preached the gospel – suffered much for the cause of Christ

Saul's Conversion

Jesus Appeared Bright Light (9:3; 22:6; 26:13) Voice (9:4-6; 22:7-10; 26:14-18) "Why persecute me?" "I am Jesus" "Go into city told what to do" Appeared to you -send to Gentles" (22:21; 26:17-20) Blinded (9:7-9; 22:11)

Saul's Conversion

Jesus Appeared **Purpose of appearance:** Qualified to be an apostle (Acts 1:22; 1 Cor. 9:1) Sent him to Gentiles (Acts 9:15-16; 22:21; 26:16-18)


Jesus Sent A Preacher Ananias told Saul what he MUST do – Acts 9:10-19

Repented (Acts 17:30-31)

He was told to be baptized, calling on the name of the Lord (Acts 22:16)



Saul After His Conversion




A Sincere, Devoted, Loyal Disciple Acts 26:19-21 (NKJV)

²⁰ but declared first to those in Damascus and in Jerusalem, and throughout all the region of Judea, and *then* to the Gentiles, that they should repent, turn to God, and do works befitting repentance. ²¹ For these reasons the Jews seized me in the temple and tried to kill *me*.



Saul After His Conversion



A Sincere, Devoted, Loyal Disciple 1 Corinthians 15:9-10 (NKJV) ⁹ For I am the least of the apostles, who am not worthy to be called an apostle, because I persecuted the church of God. ¹⁰ But by the grace of God I am what I am, and His grace toward me was not in vain; but I labored more abundantly than they all, yet not I, but the grace of God which was with me. 22




2 Corinthians 11:23-28 (NKJV)

²³ Are they ministers of Christ?--I speak as a fool--I *am* more: in labors more abundant, in stripes above measure, in prisons more frequently, in deaths often. ²⁴ From the Jews five times I received forty *stripes* minus one. ²⁵ Three times I was beaten with rods; once I was stoned; three times I was shipwrecked; a night and a day I have been in the deep; ²⁶ in journeys often, in perils of waters, in perils of robbers, in perils of my own countrymen, in perils of the Gentiles, in perils in the city, *in* perils in the wilderness, *in* perils in the sea, *in* perils among false brethren; ²⁷ in weariness and toil, in sleeplessness often, in hunger and thirst, in fastings often, in cold and nakedness-- ²⁸ besides the other things, what comes upon me daily: my deep concern for all the churches.

A Sincere, Devoted, Loyal Disciple

2 Timothy 4:6-8 (NKJV)

⁶ For I am already being poured out as a drink offering, and the time of my departure is at hand. ⁷ I have fought the good fight, I have finished the race, I have kept the faith. ⁸ Finally, there is laid up for me the crown of righteousness, ...

Jesus' "Revelation" to Paul

Galatians 1:11–2:1 – "Now I want you to know, brothers, that the gospel preached by me is not of human origin. 12 For I did not receive it from a human being, nor was I taught it, but it came through a revelation of Jesus Christ. 13 For you heard of my former way of life in Judaism... 15 But when God, who from my mother's womb had set me apart and called me through his grace, was pleased 16 to reveal his Son to me, so that I might proclaim him to the Gentiles, I did not immediately consult flesh and blood, 17 nor did I go up to Jerusalem to those who were apostles before me; rather, I went into Arabia and then returned to Damascus. 18 Then *after three years I went up to Jerusalem* to confer with Kephas and remained with him for fifteen days... 21 Then I went into the regions of Syria and Cilicia...

2:1 Then *after fourteen years I again went up to Jerusalem* with Barnabas, taking Titus along also...

Paul's New Christian Life (ca. AD 35–49)

A. <u>Jesus</u> is "revealed" to Paul.

- B. <u>Paul</u> begins preaching in **Arabia**, **Damascus**, **Syria**, and **Cilicia**, with some opposition (Gal 1:17-24; 2 Cor 11:23-33).
- C. <u>Barnabas</u> takes an interest in Paul, helps him, introduces him to other Christians (Acts 9:26-30; 11:25-30; 12:25).
- D. Sent out by church of Antioch, in northern SYRIA, <u>Barnabas & Paul</u> go preach in Cyprus, Pamphylia, Phrygia (Acts 13–14); Barnabas is leader, with Paul as his assistant (esp. Acts 14:12, Barnabas = "Zeus," Paul = "Hermes").
- E. <u>Barnabas & Paul</u> participate in "Council of Jerusalem" (*ca. AD 49, possibly later*, compare Gal 2:1-10 and Acts 15)

Cor 11:21-33 – St. Paul's Sufferings

"But what anyone dares to boast of (I am speaking in foolishness) I also dare.

22 Are they Hebrews? So am I. Are they Israelites? So am I. Are they descendants of Abraham? So am I.

²³ Are they ministers of Christ? (I am talking like an insane person.) I am still more, with far greater <u>labors</u>, far more <u>imprisonments</u>, far worse <u>beatings</u>, and numerous <u>brushes with death</u>.

²⁴ Five times at the hands of the Jews I received <u>forty lashes minus one</u>.

²⁵ Three times I was <u>beaten with rods</u>, once I was <u>stoned</u>, three times I was <u>shipwrecked</u>, I passed <u>a</u> <u>night and a day on the deep;</u>

2 Cor 11:21-33 – St. Paul's Sufferings

26 on frequent journeys, in *dangers* from rivers, *dangers* from robbers, *dangers* from my own race, *dangers* from Gentiles, *dangers* in the city, *dangers* in the wilderness, *dangers* at sea, *dangers* among false brothers;

- ²⁷ in toil and hardship, through many sleepless nights, through hunger and thirst, through frequent fastings, through cold and exposure.
- ²⁸ And apart from these things, there is the daily pressure upon me of my anxiety for all the churches.

Cor 11:21-33 – St. Paul's Sufferings (cont.)

²⁹ Who is weak, and I am not weak? Who is led to sin, and I am not indignant? ³⁰ If I must boast, I will boast of the things that show my weakness. ³¹ The God and Father of the Lord Jesus knows, he who is blessed forever, that I do not lie.

32 At Damascus, the governor under King Aretas guarded the city of Damascus, in order to seize me,

³³ but I was lowered in a basket through a window in the wall and escaped his hands.
