
Here are two pages from the Bible. Many catholics take their bible with them to church, but some churches provide bibles.




A rosary consists of of a string of beads with a crucifix. Each bead is considered to be a prayer to God and the mother of God, Mary.


Many people believe that she creates miracles. Most people pray to her about family, sickness, etc.
