



THE "JUSTICE OF GOD" describes God's perfect nature, infinitely righteous in all he is and does. God imposes just/righteous laws on his creatures and executes them righteously. Justice is not optional but an unchangeable part of who God is. He requires his rational creatures to obey his moral law and rewards or punishes them accordingly. Being infinitely righteous, He must regard and hate sin as intrinsically hateful and deserving of punishment. "He cannot deny himself" (2 Tim. 2:13).
