- Afternoon: Passover preparation (Lk. 22:7-13)
- Evening: The Passover
 - John 13:2-17: Jesus washes the disciples' feet
 - John 13:18-30; Matt. 26:20-25: Judas leaves to betray Jesus
 - Matt. 26:26-30: Jesus institutes the Lord's Supper
 - Luke 22:31-34; John 13:36-38: Jesus predicts Peter's denial.
 - John 14-17: Jesus' final discourse

Thursday

- Afternoon: Passover preparation (Lk. 22:7-13)
- Evening: The Passover
- Late Evening: In the Garden
 - Jesus' sorrow, prayer, and help: Matt. 26:36-46; Luke 22:41-46; Heb. 5:7
 - Judas' betrayal: John 18:2-11; Luke 22:47-53
 - Jesus' is arrested, His disciples forsake Him: Luke 22:54; Mark 14:50

Friday

- Pre-dawn: Before Annas
 - Before Annas: John 18:12-14, 19-23
 - Peter's first denial: John 18:15-18

Friday

- Pre-dawn: Before Annas
- Early Dawn: Before Caiaphas
 - Before Caiaphas and the Sanhedrin: John 18:24; Matt. 26:57-68
 - Peter's second and third denials: Luke 22:56-62
 - Judas' remorse; hangs himself: Matt. 27:3-8

Friday

- Pre-dawn: Before Annas
- Early Dawn: Before Caiaphas
- Sunrise: Roman Trial
 - Before Pilate: John 18:28-38
 - Before Herod: Luke 23:6-12
 - Pilate has Jesus scourged: Matt. 27:15-31

- Early Dawn: Before Caiaphas
- Sunrise: Roman Trial
- Morning: The Crucifixion
 - Jesus led to Golgotha/Calvary: Matt. 27:31-34;
Luke 23:26-33
 - Jesus Crucified: Mark 15:25-32; John 19:17-23-29

Friday

- Pre-dawn: Before Annas
- Early Dawn: Before Caiaphas
- Sunrise: Roman Trial
- Morning: The Crucifixion
- Afternoon:
 - 3:00 p.m., Jesus Dies (John 19:30; Mark 15:33-39; Luke 23:44-47)
 - Jesus is buried (Matt. 27:57-66).

“After Three Days”

- Friday night: Matt. 27:61; Luke 22:55, 56
- Saturday:
 - The disciples rest: Luke 22:56;
 - Roman soldier set over the tomb: Matt. 27:62-66
- The First day of the Week.
 - It began to dawn: Matt. 28:1; John 20:1
 - When the sun had risen: Matt:28:2-10.

He Is Risen!

- 1 Corinthians 15:1-8
- By this gospel we can be saved.

- We must hold fast the word which is preached (2 John 9).
- Do you believe the gospel?
