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- Without any doubt, we husbands aren't always the men of our wives' dreams.

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 - "Husbands, love your wives, as Christ loved the church and gave himself up for her" (Eph 5:25, ESV).
 - "Husbands, live with your wives in an understanding way, showing honor to the woman was the weaker vessel" (1 Pt 3:7, ESV).

JOSEPH HERE PROVIDES AN EXAMPLE OF WHAT HUSBANDS SHOULD BE.

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 - Since the 5th century, there has been a belief that Joseph was an older man, widowed, & have children from his previous marriage.
 - This material comes from a heretical document & is used to explain how Jesus could have brothers and sisters while Mary was a perpetual virgin.

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- The truth is that Joseph leaves us "A Witness of a Godly Husband."
- "A Godly Husband" is:
 - A LAWFUL HUSBAND.
 - A LOVING HUSBAND.
 - A LISTENING HUSBAND.
 - A LIMITED HUSBAND.

vv 18-19. A LAWFUL HUSBAND

• Joseph was a lawful man.

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- "Now the birth of Jesus Christ took place in this way. When his mother Mary had been betrothed to Joseph, before they came together she was found to be with child from the Holy Spirit. And her husband Joseph, being a just man and unwilling to put her to shame, resolved to divorce her quietly" (vv 18-19, ESV).

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 - Betrothed couples didn't spend much time together.

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 - Joseph knows that the child cannot be his.
 - If Joseph didn't know Mary well, how likely is he to believe her?

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 - "We were not born of sexual immorality" (Jn 8:41, ESV). Some believe the Jews were making a veiled insult toward Jesus.
 - Many Jewish texts have ascribed Jesus' conception to immorality.

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 - "The righteous will shine like the sun in the kingdom of their Father" (Mt 13:43, ESV).

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 - If Joseph married his betrothed, it would be a sign that the child was his. E.g., someone caught raping a woman had to marry her (Deut 22:28-29).

• Joseph is also A LAWFUL HUSBAND in doing what the angel instructs.

ARE WE LAWFUL HUSBANDS?

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 - "As for me and my house, we will serve the LORD" (Josh 24:15, ESV).
 - Do we seek to love our wives the way Jesus loves the church?

ARE WE LAWFUL MEN?

v 19. A LOVING MAN

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 - Being a just man, he needs to preserve his reputation.
 - But, he loves Mary, so he decides to divorce her quietly.



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
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 - Mary would never have found another husband. If her parents died, she would have no means of support.
 - She would have been subjected to the death penalty.
 - Granted, it wasn't used in this time period.
 - But, could you imagine what people would have said?



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 - "Husbands, love your wives, as Christ loved the church and gave himself up for her" (Eph 5:25, ESV).
 - "Husbands, love your wives, and do not be harsh with them" (Col 3:19, ESV).

ARE WE LOVING OUR WIVES?

vv 20-24 A LISTENING HUSBAND

• Joseph listens to the law of God.

• "But as he considered these things, behold, an angel of the Lord appeared to him in a dream, saying, 'Joseph, son of David, do not fear to take Mary as your wife, for that which is conceived in her is from the Holy Spirit. She will bear a son, and you shall call his name Jesus, for he will save his people from their sins.' All this took place to fulfill what the Lord had spoken by the prophet: 'Behold, the virgin shall conceive and bear a son, and they shall call his name Immanuel' (which means, God with us). When Joseph woke from sleep, he did as the angel of the Lord commanded him: he took his wife" (vv 20-24, ESV).

I WOULD LOVE TO HAVE SEEN THE LOOK ON JOSEPH'S FACE!

But, the reaction of his heart is even more amazing! I WOULD LOVE TO HAVE SEEN THE LOOK ON JOSEPH'S FACE!

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 - When the death angel went through Egypt, he slew only the firstborn.
 - "Consecrate to me all the firstborn. Whatever is the first to open the womb among the people of Israel, both of man and of beast, is mine" (Ex 13:2, ESV).
- The firstborn was a sign of vitality & strength.

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 - The fact that he goes through with the marriage is a sign that he has been immoral.
 - He gave up the right to father his firstborn.
 - He went against societal custom by marrying a woman with child.
 - By delaying the consummation of the marriage, Joseph could not produce evidence of Mary's virginity (Dt 22:15).

THINK ABOUT ALL THIS!

Joseph gives up his will & desires for the will of God! THINK ABOUT ALL THIS!

HOW WILLING ARE WE TO OBEY GOD REGARDLESS OF OUR DESIRES?

v 25 A LIMITED HUSBAND

• Joseph limited himself sexually.

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- He "knew her not until she had given birth to a son. And he called his name Jesus" (v 25, ESV).

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 - The literal Gr is "and was knowing her not."
 - It draws attention to the span between the wedding & the birth of Jesus during which Joseph did not have sexual intercourse with Mary.

WHY DID JOSEPH NOT HAVE MARITAL RELATIONS WITH MARY UNTIL AFTER JESUS WAS BORN?

• Not because there is something inappropriate about sex in marriage.

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 - "Let your fountain be blessed, and rejoice in the wife of your youth, a lovely deer, a graceful doe. Let her breasts fill you at all times with delight; be intoxicated always in her love" (Prov 5:18-19, ESV).

- Not because there is something inappropriate about sex in marriage.
 Prov 5:18-19.
 - "The husband should give to his wife her conjugal rights, and likewise the wife to her husband. For the wife does not have authority over her own body, but the husband does. Likewise the husband does not have authority over his own body, but the wife does. Do not deprive one another" (1 Cor 7:3-5, ESV).

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- Therefore, it must be to demonstrate beyond all doubt that Jesus was not conceived from him.
- Interestingly, Jewish teachers taught that males had no self-control & should thus marry very early.
- Joseph stands as a model of selfcontrol.

WHAT SHOULD WE LEARN FROM JOSEPH'S SELF-CONTROL?

• Sex is not the most important part of life.

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 - To the unmarried and the widows I say that it is good for them to remain single" (1 Cor 7:8, ESV).

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 - Scripture presents a totally different view of sex.
 - Sexuality is wholesome & good.
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 - "Do not deprive one another, except perhaps by agreement for a limited time, that you may devote yourselves to prayer; but then come together again, so that Satan may not tempt you because of your lack of self-control" (1 Cor 7:5, ESV).

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- Men dare not treat their wives as only sexual objects.
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- Men dare not treat their wives as only sexual objects.
 - I'm afraid that some Christian men view their wives that way.
 - However, Joseph does not have sex with Mary for a while.
 - What if something were to happen to our wives & we could not have marital relations with them?

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
