

Some people have something to say, others have to say something. A prophet is one who has something to say and has to say it.



prophecies come true




GOD'S TOUCHPOINTS

- Prophets were God's touchpoints. The patriarchs, judges, priests and even some kings played a prophetic role.
- They came to the frontline during and after the Kings came into power, as God ceased to be able to connect with the Kings and Prophets were the prime source of communication from God to man.



THEIR ROLE

- They had one purpose to be God's mouthpiece
- They had high influence access to Kings and leaders
- They had to sacrifice their personal lives for the cause
- They were most often unpopular
- They often had to suffer bad consequences of speaking God's truth - sometimes death eg. Isiah
 - They faced terrible consequences on even the smallest deviation to disobeying God - man of God





JERABOAM AND THE MAN OF GOD



By the word of the LORD a man of God came from Judah to Bethel, as Jeroboam was standing by the altar to make an offering. ² By the word of the LORD he cried out against the altar: "Altar, altar! This is what the LORD says: 'A son named Josiah will be born to the house of David. On you he will sacrifice the priests of the high places who make offerings here, and human bones will be burned on you." 1 Kings 13

JERABOAM AND THE MAN OF GOD

- GREAT POWER



³ That same day the man of God gave a sign: "This is the sign the LORD has declared: The altar will be split apart and the ashes on it will be poured out."

⁴ When King Jeroboam heard what the man of God cried out against the altar at Bethel, he stretched out his hand from the altar and said, "Seize him!" But the hand he stretched out toward the man shriveled up, so that he could not pull it back. ⁵ Also, the altar was split apart and its ashes poured out according to the sign given by the man of God by the word of the LORD.

⁶ Then the king said to the man of God, "Intercede with the LORD your God and pray for me that my hand may be restored." So the man of God interceded with the LORD, and the king's hand was restored and became as it was before. – 1 Kings 13


- ¹⁶ The man of God said, "I cannot turn back and go with you, nor can I eat bread or drink water with you in this place. ¹⁷ I have been told by the word of the LORD: 'You must not eat bread or drink water there or return by the way you came."
- ¹⁸ The old prophet answered, "I too am a prophet, as you are. And an angel said to me by the word of the LORD: 'Bring him back with you to your house so that he may eat bread and drink water." (But he was lying to him.) ¹⁹ So the man of God returned with him and ate and drank in his house.
- ²⁰ While they were sitting at the table, the word of the LORD came to the old prophet who had brought him back. ²¹ He cried out to the man of God who had come from Judah, "This is what the LORD says: 'You have defied the word of the LORD and have not kept the command the LORD your God gave you. ²² You came back and ate bread and drank water in the place where he told you not to eat or drink. Therefore your body will not be buried in the tomb of your ancestors." 1 kings 13

PROPHET CONDEMNS AHAB - HE HAD TO SAY IT..


- ³⁵ By the word of the LORD one of the company of the prophets said to his companion, "Strike me with your weapon," but he refused.
- ³⁶ So the prophet said, "Because you have not obeyed the LORD, as soon as you leave me a lion will kill you." And after the man went away, a lion found him and killed him.
- ³⁷ The prophet found another man and said, "Strike me, please." So the man struck him and wounded him. ³⁸ Then the prophet went and stood by the road waiting for the king. He disguised himself with his headband down over his eyes. ³⁹ As the king passed by, the prophet called out to him, "Your servant went into the thick of the battle, and someone came to me with a captive and said, 'Guard this man. If he is missing, it will be your life for his life, or you must pay a talent^[b] of silver.' ⁴⁰ While your servant was busy here and there, the man disappeared."
- "That is your sentence," the king of Israel said. "You have pronounced it yourself."
- ⁴¹ Then the prophet quickly removed the headband from his eyes, and the king of Israel recognized him as one of the prophets. ⁴² He said to the king, "This is what the LORD says: 'You have set free a man I had determined should die.^[2] Therefore it is your life for his life, your people for his people.'" ⁴³ Sullen and angry, the king of Israel went to his palace in Samaria. 1 Kings 20

GOD PUTS A LYING SPIRIT IN PROPHETS

- ¹⁹ Micaiah continued, "Therefore hear the word of the LORD: I saw the LORD sitting on his throne with all the multitudes of heaven standing around him on his right and on his left. ²⁰ And the LORD said, 'Who will entice Ahab into attacking Ramoth Gilead and going to his death there?'
- "One suggested this, and another that. ²¹ Finally, a spirit came forward, stood before the LORD and said, 'I will entice him.'
- ²² "By what means?' the LORD asked.
- "I will go out and be a deceiving spirit in the mouths of all his prophets," he said.
- "You will succeed in enticing him,' said the LORD. 'Go and do it.'
- ²³ "So now the LORD has put a deceiving spirit in the mouths of all these prophets of yours. The LORD has decreed disaster for you." I Kings 22




The "not keeping or advocating God's commandments sign"





Lesson 29: Elijah the prophet who never died

OT WALKTHRU- THE PROPHETIC ERA

- 1. The Early Prophets
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BACKGROUND

KING AHAB'S TRYST WITH THE PROPHETS

- Known to be one of the worst kings, several prophets attempted to reach King Ahab
- 400 Prophets of Asherah dined at the queens table
- God's prophets were killed
- Elijah was the foremost of them and demonstrated God's power in a mighty way by getting all prophets of Baal consumed by fire.
 - Another prophet got himself wounded to demo to the king God's plan (1 Kings 20).
 - It is eventually the lying prophets who deceive Ahab Miciah finally prophesied his death and was punished for it.

ELIJAH THE PROPHET

- From dynamic display
- To deep depression
- 1 kings 18 and 19
- Faces the king and all prophets of Baal and vanquishes them with gusto
 - Trifles the fear of obadiah
 - Suddenly gets afraid due to Jezebel
- And runs for his life

1 KINGS 18

- 14 And now you tell me to go to my master and say, 'Elijah is here.' He will kill me!"
- 15 Elijah said, "As the Lord Almighty lives, whom I serve, I will surely present myself to Ahab today."
 - Elijah on Mount Carmel
 - 16 So Obadiah went to meet Ahab and told him, and Ahab went to meet Elijah. 17 When he saw Elijah, he said to him, "Is that you, you troubler of Israel?"
 - 18 "I have not made trouble for Israel," Elijah replied. "But you and your father's family have. You have abandoned the Lord's commands and have followed the Baals. 19 Now summon the people from all over Israel to meet me on Mount Carmel. And bring the four hundred and fifty prophets of Baal and the four hundred prophets of Asherah, who eat at Jezebel's table."
 - 20 So Ahab sent word throughout all Israel and assembled the prophets on Mount Carmel. 21 Elijah went before the people and said, "How long will you waver between two opinions? If the Lord is God, follow him; but if Baal is God, follow him."
 - But the people said nothing.





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1 KINGS 19

- 19 Now Ahab told Jezebel everything Elijah had done and how he had killed all the prophets with the sword. 2 So Jezebel sent a messenger to Elijah to say, "May the gods deal with me, be it ever so severely, if by this time tomorrow I do not make your life like that of one of them."
- 3 Elijah was afraid and ran for his life. When he came to Beersheba in Judah, he left his servant there, 4 while he himself went a day's journey into the wilderness. He came to a broom bush, sat down under it and prayed that he might die. "I have had enough, Lord," he said. "Take my life; I am no better than my ancestors." 5 Then he lay down under the bush and fell asleep.
- All at once an angel touched him and said, "Get up and eat." 6 He looked around, and there by his head was some bread baked over hot coals, and a jar of water. He ate and drank and then lay down again.

7 The angel of the Lord came back a second time and touched him and said, "Get up and eat, for the journey is too much for you." 8 So he got up and ate and drank. Strengthened by that food, he traveled forty days and forty nights until he reached Horeb, the mountain of God. 9 There he went into a cave and spent the night.

1 KINGS 19 CONT'D

The Lord Appears to Elijah

And the word of the Lord came to him: "What are you doing here, Elijah?" 10 He replied, "I have been very zealous for the Lord God Almighty. The Israelites have rejected your covenant, torn down your altars, and put your prophets to death with the sword. I am the only one left, and now they are trying to kill me too."

11 The Lord said, "Go out and stand on the mountain in the presence of the Lord, for the Lord is about to pass by."

Then a great and powerful wind tore the mountains apart and shattered the rocks before the Lord, but the Lord was not in the wind. After the wind there was an earthquake, but the Lord was not in the earthquake came a fire, but the Lord was not in the fire. And after the fire came a gentle whisper. 13 When Elijah heard it, he pulled his cloak over his face and went out and stood at the mouth of the cave.

Then a voice said to him, "What are you doing here, Elijah?"

14 He replied, "I have been very zealous for the Lord God Almighty. The Israelites have rejected your covenant, torn down your altars, and put your prophets to death with the sword. I am the only one left, and now they are trying to kill me too."

15 The Lord said to him, "Go back the way you came, and go to the Desert of Damascus. When you get there, anoint Hazael king over Aram. 16 Also, anoint Jehu son of Nimshi king over Israel, and anoint Elisha son of Shaphat from Abel Meholah to succeed you as prophet. 17 Jehu will put to death any who escape the sword of Hazael, and Elisha will put to death any who escape the sword of Jehu. 18 Yet I reserve seven thousand in Israel—all whose knees have not bowed down to Baal and whose mouths have not kissed him."

REFERENCES - ELIJAH

- Elijah stood up boldly for God in a time when idolatryhad swept his land. In fact, his name means "My God is Yah(weh)."
 - The false god he opposed was <u>Baal</u>, the favorite deity of <u>Jezebel</u>, wife of King Ahab of Israel. To please Jezebel, Ahab had altars erected to Baal, and the queen murdered God's prophets.
- Elijah appeared before King Ahab to announce God's curse: "As the LORD, the God of Israel, lives, whom I serve, there will be neither dew nor rain in the next few years except at my word." (1 Kings 17:1, NIV)
 - Then Elijah fled to the brook Cherith, east of the Jordan River, where ravens brought him bread and meat. When the brook dried up, God sent Elijah to live with a widow in Zarephath. God performed another miracle there, blessing the woman's oil and flour so it did not run out. Unexpectedly, the widow's son died. Elijah stretched himself on the boy's body three times, and God restored the child's life.
 - Confident of the power of God, Elijah challenged the 450 prophets of Baal and the 400 prophets of the false god Asherah to a showdown on Mount Carmel. The idolaters sacrificed a bull and cried out to Baal from morning until nightfall, even slashing their skin until blood flowed, but nothing happened. Elijah then rebuilt the altar of the Lord, sacrificing a bull there.
 - He put the burnt offering on it, along with wood. He had a servant douse the sacrifice and wood with four jars of water, three times, until all was thoroughly soaked. <u>Elijah called on the Lord</u>, and God's fire fell from heaven, consuming the offering, the wood, the altar, the water, and even the dust around it.
 - The people fell on their faces, shouting, "The Lord, he is God; the Lord, he is God." (1 Kings 18:39, NIV) Elijah ordered the people to slay the 850 false prophets.
 - Elijah prayed, and rain fell on Israel. Jezebel was furious at the loss of her prophets, however, and swore to kill him. Afraid, Elijah ran to the wilderness, sat under a broom tree, and in his despair, asked God to take his life. Instead, the prophet slept, and an angel brought him food. Strengthened, Elijah went 40 days and 40 nights to Mount Horeb, where God appeared to him in a whisper.
 - God ordered Elijah to anoint his successor, Elisha, whom he found plowing with 12 yoke of oxen. Elisha killed the animals for a sacrifice and followed his master. Elijah went on to prophesy the deaths of Ahab, King Ahaziah, and Jezebel.
 - Like <u>Enoch</u>, Elijah did not die. God sent chariots and horses of fire and took Elijah up to heaven in a whirlwind, while Elisha stood watching.

REFERENCES - ELISHA

- Elisha replaced <u>Elijah</u> as Israel's chief prophet and also performed many miracles through the power of God. He was a servant of the people, demonstrating <u>God's love</u> and compassion.
- Elisha means "God is <u>salvation</u>." He was anointed by Elijah while plowing in his father Shaphat's field with 12 yoke of oxen.
- He received a double portion of Elijah's spirit before the latter was taken up to heaven in a whirlwind. Elisha served as a prophet of the northern kingdom for more than 50 years, through the reigns of kings Jehoram, Jehu, Jehoahaz, and into the reign of Joash.
 - Elisha's <u>miracles</u> included purifying a spring at Jericho, multiplying a widow's oil, bringing a Shunammite woman's son back to life (reminiscent of a miracle by Elijah), purifying a poisonous stew, and multiplying loaves of bread (foreshadowing a <u>miracle by Jesus</u>).
- One of his most memorable acts was the healing of the Syrian army officer Naaman of leprosy. Naaman was told to wash in the Jordan River seven times. He overcame his unbelief, trusted God, and was cured, causing him to say "Now I know that there is no God in all the world except in Israel." (2 Kings 5:16, NIV)
 - Elisha helped rescue the armies of Israel on several occasions. While events of the kingdom unfolded, Elisha dropped out of the picture for a time, then reappeared in 2 Kings 13:14, on his death bed. The final miracle attributed to him happened after he died. A group of Israelites, frightened by approaching raiders, threw the body of one of their dead comrades into Elisha's tomb. When the corpse touched Elisha's bones, the dead soldier came to life and stood on his feet.

REFERENCES - ELISHA..CONT'D

Accomplishments of Elisha the Prophet:

Elisha protected the kings and armies of Israel. He also showed the common people that God was concerned with their individual lives and was present among them.

Strengths of Elisha the Prophet:

Like his mentor, Elisha demanded rejection of idols and faithfulness to the true God. His miracles, both spectacular and minor, showed that God can change history as well as the <u>everyday lives</u> of his followers.

Life Lessons from Elisha:

God loves all people. The poor and helpless are as important to him as the rich and powerful. God wants us to help those in need, no matter who they are.

2 Kings 2:9

When they had crossed, Elijah said to Elisha, "Tell me, what can I do for you before I am taken from you?" "Let me inherit a double portion of your spirit," Elisha replied. (NIV)2 Kings 6:17 And Elisha prayed, "O LORD, open his eyes so he may see." Then the LORD opened the servant's eyes, and he looked and saw the hills full of horses and chariots of fire all around Elisha. (NIV)





TIMELINE OF THE PROPHETS





ISAIAH

- Isaiah is the first of the four "Major prophets".

 Major prophets are so named due to the extensiveness of the content and not otherwise.
 - In Chapters 1-39, Isaiah breathes Judgment and highlights the sins of Israel
 - Chapters 40-55, speaks of the return and restoration of Israel and of Christ's coming
 - In chapters 56-66, Isaiah writes of the new Heavens and Earth

Continued during Ahaz's reign (731-715 BC)
Continued during Hezekiah's reign (715-686 BC)
Ended during Manasseh's reign (686-??? BC)

THE BOOK OF ISAIAH - THE MINI BIBLE

- Resembles the Bible in miniature
- > Total 66 chapters, 39+27=66
- Key word: Salvation
- Messianic prophecies: more than any other O.T. writer – 700 years before Christ!
- Quoted in N.T. far more than any other prophet – 21 times

ISAIAH 1 - 39 JUDGEMENT

1 The vision concerning Judah and Jerusalem that Isaiah son of Amoz saw during the reigns of Uzziah, Jotham, Ahaz and Hezekiah, kings of Judah.

A Rebellious Nation

- ² Hear me, you heavens! Listen, earth! For the LORD has spoken: "I reared children and brought them up, but they have rebelled against me.
- ³ The ox knows its master, the donkey its owner's manger, but Israel does not know, my people do not understand."
- "Come now, let us settle the matter," says the LORD. (Isaiah 1:1-3)

UNDER BURE

TREES IN THE WASTELAND

The lack of available water, including rain, is one reason why Israel had been a desolate, unproductive land during much of the past 2000 years. But, during the 1900s, when many Jews returned to their ancient homeland, they built a network of irrigation systems. And during the past century, more than 200 million trees have been planted in Israel.

I will make rivers flow on barren heights, and springs within the valleys. I will turn the desert into pools of water, and the parched ground into springs. I will put in the desert the cedar and the acacia, the myrtle and the olive. I will set pines in the wasteland, the fir and the cypress together, so that people may see and know, may consider and understand, that the hand of the Lord has done this, that the Holy One of Israel has created it. (Isaiah 41:18-20)

"Forget the former things; do not dwell on the past. See, I am doing a new thing! Now it springs up; do you not perceive it?I am making a way in the wilderness and streams in the wasteland. (Isaiah 43:18,19)

<u> ISAIAH 56 – 66 NEW HEAVENS AND EARTH</u>

THE ECONOMIC MIRACLE OF ISRAEL

An oil rig at Atlit, had been erected by an American Christian company whose CEO, citing a peculiar interpretation of a biblical promise to the Tribe of Asher (Deut. 33:24), was certain he'd find huge quantities of oil beneath the western border of that tribes ancient territory.

The company ended up losing millions of dollars. But just 15 years later, Israel discovered vast natural gas fields a mere 50 miles west of Atlit in the depths of

BATHED IN PROSPERITY, OIL

About Asher he said: "Most blessed of sons is Asher; let him be favored by his brothers, and let him bathe his feet in oil. SIX DAY WAR AGAINST ISRAEL

The Six-Day War took place in June 1967 between June 5th and June 10th. The Israelis defended the war as a preventative military effort to counter what the Israelis saw as an impending attack by Arab nations that surrounded Israel.

The war was against Syria, Jordan and Egypt.. Rather than wait to be attacked, the Israelis launched a hugely successful military campaign against its perceived enemies. The air forces of Egypt, Jordan, Syria and Iraq were all but destroyed on June 5th. By June 7th, many Egyptian tanks had been destroyed in the Sinai Desert and Israeli forces reached the Suez Canal. On the same day, the whole of the west bank of the Jordan River had been cleared of Jordanian forces. The Golan Heights were captured from Syria and Israeli forces moved 30 miles into Syria itself.

The war was a disaster for the Arab world and temporarily weakened the man who was seen as the leader of the Arabs – Gamal Abdul Nasser of Egypt. The war was a military disaster for the Arabs but it was also a massive blow to the Arabs morale. Here were four of the strongest Arab nations systematically defeated by just one nation.

The success of the campaign must have surprised the Israelis.


