

First Point

Limited Options

Matthew 1:18-19



¹⁸ Now the birth of Jesus Christ took place in this way...

This may be one of the most pro-life verses in the entire Bible!



Joseph's Options were Limited

• No second chance option.

- No way to keep Mary and avoid shame.
- Only one way to regain both reputation and resources.

God often shows us that we have more options than we think. Although Joseph seemed to be doing the right thing by breaking the engagement, God helped him make the best decision. We should always seek God's wisdom, especially when our decisions affect others.

Clear Instructions

Clear Instructions

1. Do not "shrink back" from taking Mary as your wife! 2. You shall call His name Jesus!



An Unclear but Crucial Comment

²² All this took place to fulfill what the Lord had spoken by the prophet: ²³ "Behold, the virgin shall conceive and bear a son, and they shall call his name Immanuel" (which means, God with us). - Matthew 1:22-23

Thorough Obedience

Matthew 1:24-25



Some important tenses for some important theology!

²⁵ but **knew** her not...

Imperfect Tense suggests an ongoing action

Son. Suggests that a normal sexual relationship ensued after this.



Some Key Lessons from Joseph

 Limited options tempt us to choose the lesser of evils. Seek better options by praying to the Limitless God!



Some Key Lessons from Joseph

2. Fear tempts us to shrink back from hard decisions. Faith calls us to step forward!

3. Delayed obedience is disobedience. Partial obedience is disobedience. Thorough obedience delight's God's heart!
