*The names of the twelve apostles are these: first, Simon, who is called Peter, and Andrew his brother; James the son of Zebedee, and John his brother; Philip and Bartholomew; Thomas and Matthew the tax collector; James the son of Alphaeus, and Thaddaeus; Simon the Cananaean, and **Judas Iscariot, who betrayed him.***

- “... Judas Iscariot, who betrayed him.” *(Matthew 10.3)*
- “...and Judas Iscariot, who betrayed him.” *(Mark 3.19)*
- “...and Judas Iscariot, who became a traitor.” *(Luke 6.16)*

The Man of Kerioth

- The name Iscariot means “man of Kerioth”
 - Kerioth was a town in the southwest tip of Judah. (*Joshua 12.25*)
 - Kerioth was also a city of Moab. (*Amos 2.2*)



Judas – The Treasurer

- Judas was the moneybag holder among the apostles:
 - John 12.6
 - John 13.29



The Legacy of Judas

Then one of the twelve, whose name was Judas Iscariot, went to the chief priests and said, “What will you give me if I deliver him over to you?” And they paid him thirty pieces of silver. And from that moment he sought an opportunity to betray him.

(Matthew 26:14-16; ESV)



The Legacy of Judas

- *The price of a slave. (Exodus 21.32)*
- *NIV Study Bible: 120 denarii (one denarius was a days work for a laborer)*
