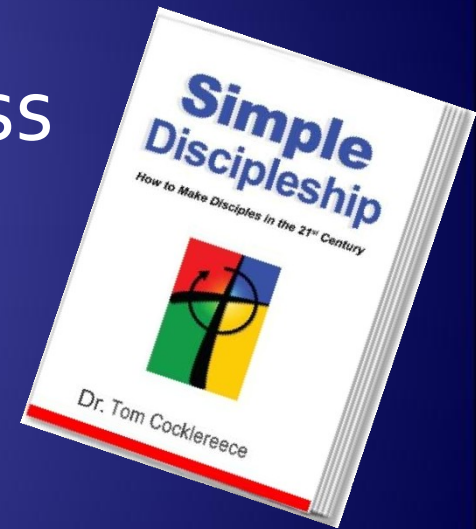

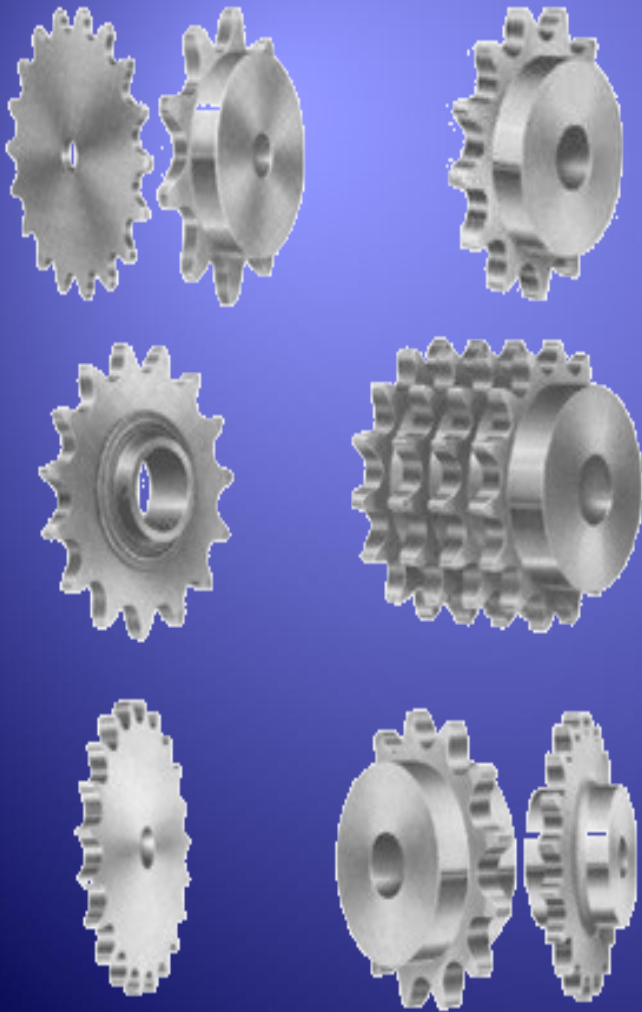

- l Buffet programs/events are not a disciple-making process.
- e Churches are not missionally active in community.

Programs vs. Processes



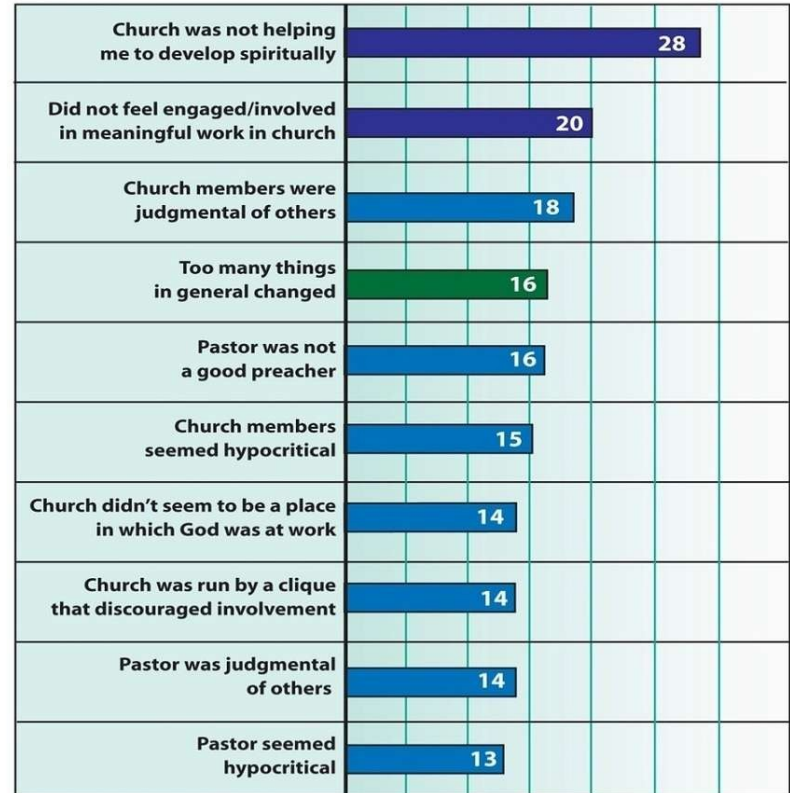
Why People Leave Church

The Great Commission

Matthew 28:19-20

- ◆ Jesus did not say, “Go make converts.”
- ◆ “Baptizing” is only one aspect of “making disciples.”
- ◆ Jesus did not place all of the responsibility for discipleship on the new Christian.
- ◆ Jesus placed the responsibility for “making disciples” on the church.
- ◆ A church is healthy if she is baptizing and discipling.

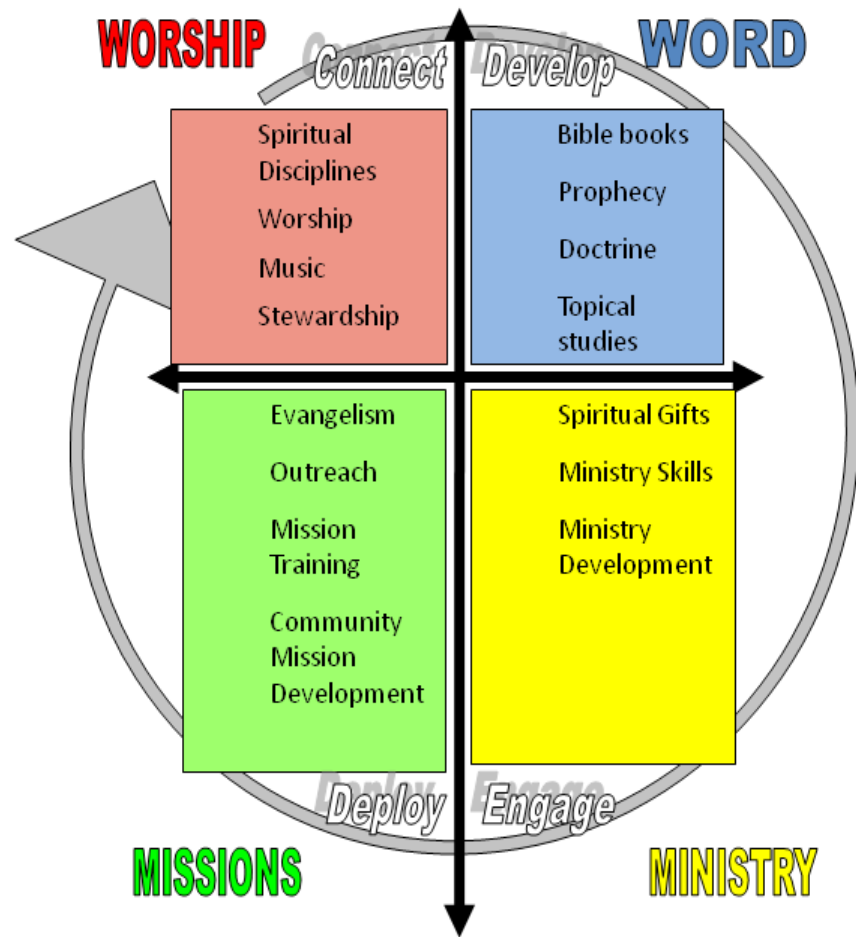

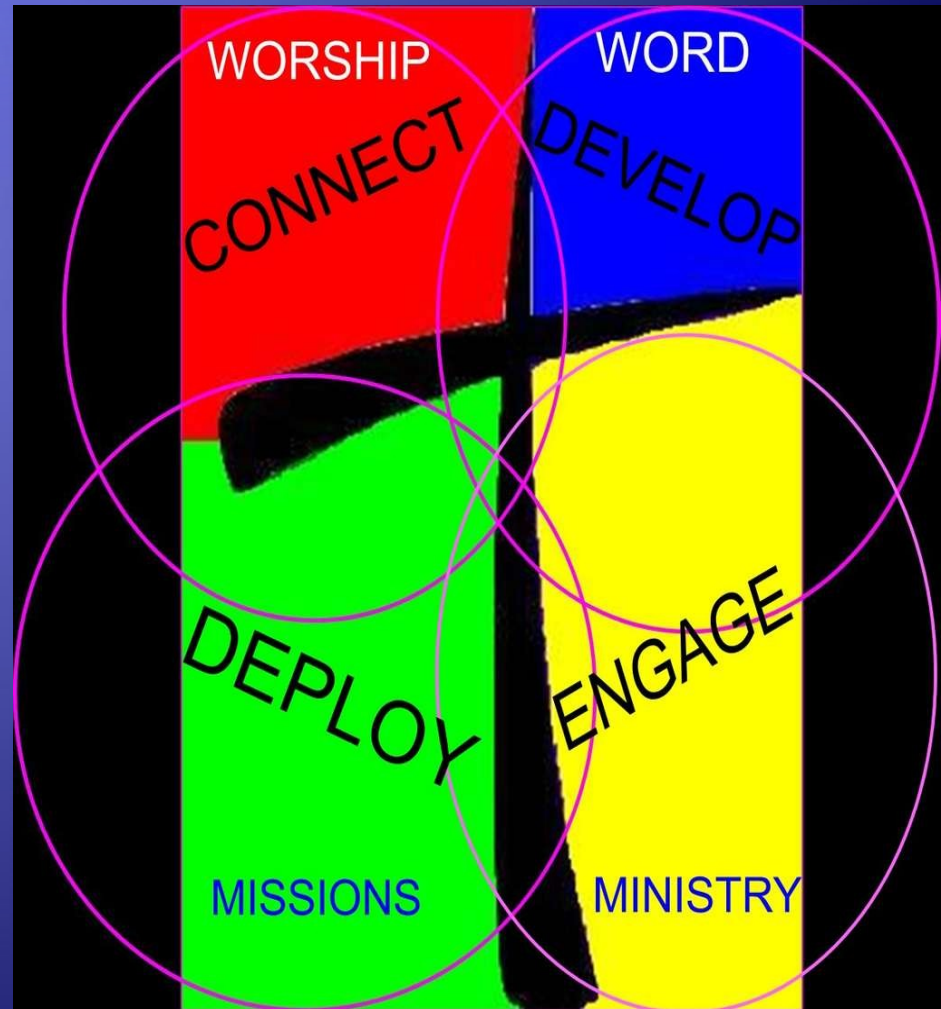

A Word of Caution

- ◆ Requires WORK!
- ◆ Not a “quick fix.”
- ◆ Cultivating change takes time and effort.
- ◆ Not a substitute for prayer, vision, building consensus, and developing an organizational culture that seeks a God-given revelation.

A Word of Caution

- ◆ SD is not intended to be a program.
 - If you use SD as one more program, IT WILL FAIL!
 - If you take the SD paradigm and try to fit it in to your silo paradigm, IT WILL FAIL!
 - If you saturate it in prayer, WORK, and follow the process, you will likely experience success.

What SD Can Do for Your Church

1. Unleashes all leaders to participate in discipleship.
 2. Reduces turf mentality and unhealthy competition.
 3. Provides horizontal measurements across all ministries allowing leaders to track the progress of the people in the process.
- ◆ To what degree are class members participating in each area of ministry?
 - ◆ How might the class leaders help people improve their scores?

What SD Can Do for Your Church

1. Assist members to better understand what their church expects of them.
2. Assist members to better understand to what degree they are meeting the expectations of their church.
3. Firmly root core faith values and expectations within the total membership.
4. Assist members to better understand what their next spiritual step is.

What SD Can Do for Your Church

1. Assist Sunday School teachers to be better leaders.
2. Improve involvement, prayer, fellowship, attendance, and discipleship in Sunday school classes.
3. Unify and mobilize the Sunday School achieve the purposes of the church.
4. Assist the staff and lay leaders to plan according to the purpose of the church—to make disciples.

What SD Can Do for Your Church

- Assist the staff in creating positive motivation for the membership to embody the expectations of the church.

Creates a spontaneous accountability culture in the church.

- h Simplicity at a time when people are searching for it and churches are trying to reduce budgets and focus on the main thing—making disciples.

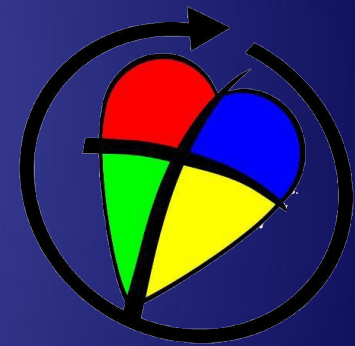

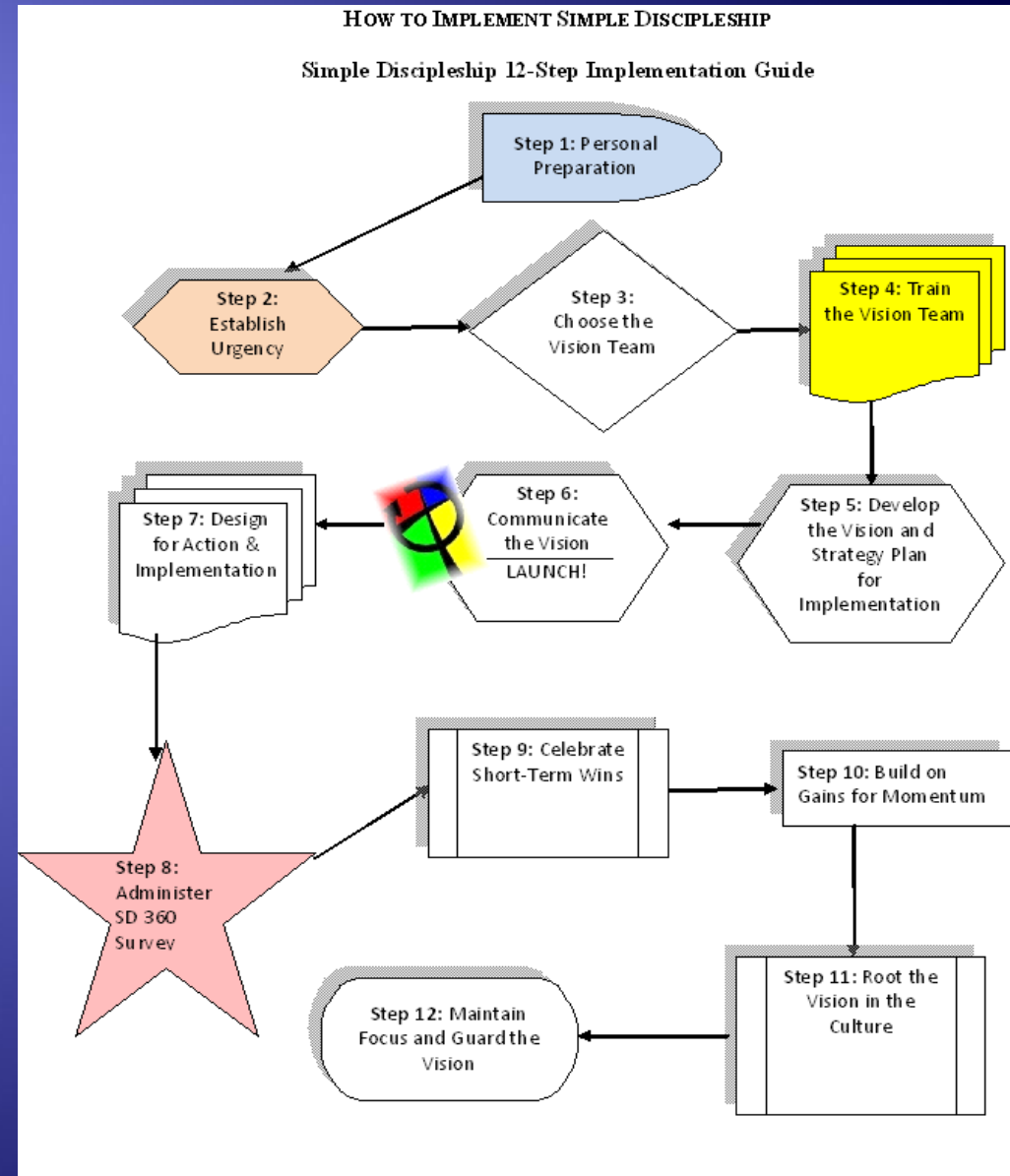
