Life of St. Paul

- Paul was the greatest missionary of the Christian Church
- He was born between 5 and 10 AD at Tarsus in Cilicia with both Jewish parents
- Well educated in Jewish and non-Jewish studies

Life of St. Paul

- Saul was his Jewish name
- Studied under the great Jewish rabbi- Gamaliel
- He became a persecutor of the followers of Jesus Christ

- He experienced conversion in Damascus and became a Christian
- Was then transformed into an ardent zealous apostle of Christ
- He had three missionary trips throughout ASIA minor

- His final trip to Rome was his lasthe was arrested and acquitted.
- Again, he was arrested and beheaded at Rome during the reign of emperor Nero.
