


This shows the destructive nature of sin. Sin divides men from God. Sinners are driven apart from Him, they do not know Him, neither can they enjoy fellowship with Him.




Sin not only displeases God, but also separates the people He created from the glory He intends for them.


From birth everyone is separated from God. If this was not the case, every man, woman and child would know God naturally. Obviously this is not so!


Because we need to understand how wide sin spreads - it is much more than simply doing something wrong, there is a greater depth and width to the idea.





Rasha: often translated 'wicked' or 'ungodly' (Psalm 1:6; Psalm 37:28). **Asham**: to offend or be guilty (Genesis 26:10; Leviticus 5:15-16, used of a guilt offering).




The idea of sin has within it the reality of something that has been lost, diverted or broken. It separates us from a loving God, it causes trouble between men, and it disrupts man in himself.

This is not a forced effort; **the Holy Spirit will show us** this in our lives (John 16:7-10).


Our responsibility is:

your sins. This is vital if you want to be


a disciple of Jesus.
