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What's Missing.

There are only a few words in a sentence that can change the meaning by their absence.




But with just 1 or 2 missing words in the right places the Devil can change a doctrine.

With as little as a *brush stroke*, an entire doctrine can be changed...

So...

Do these verses show Jesus angry?

Did Jesus Sin? At the beginning of His ministry:

John 2:13-15 (KJV)

... Jesus went up to Jerusalem... And when he had made a scourge of small cords, he drove them all out of the temple, and the sheep, and the oxen; and poured out the changers' money, and overthrew the tables...

Did Jesus Sin? At the end of His ministry:

At the end of His ministry:

Mark 11:15-16 (KJV)

And... Jesus... began to cast out them that sold and bought in the temple, and overthrew the tables of the moneychangers, and the seats of them that sold doves; And would not suffer that any man should carry any vessel through the temple.

It's clear as can be.

At the beginning of His ministry, And at the end of His ministry,

Jesus was angry!

It's also clear that it was righteous anger.
