



Having learnt the lesson, Simon Peter had to deny <u>his own</u> feelings and subject himself to God's plan with the Lord (and himself)



What might we have done?

"True character is revealed in the choices a human being makes under pressure - the greater the pressure, the deeper the revelation, the truer the choice to the character's essential nature." Robert McKee (Screenwriter)
